Dear Governor Ducey:

It is my pleasure to submit the FY 2015 Arizona Department of Racing (ADOR) Annual Report. This report reflects statutory requirements as they relate to the Department's regulatory, fiscal, and administrative responsibilities.

During fiscal year 2015 the Department regulated and supervised live and simulcast horse and greyhound racing and pari-mutuel wagering at two commercial horse tracks, one greyhound track, eight county fair racing meetings, and 62 teletracking locations throughout Arizona. The total pari-mutuel handle for all racing was \$157.8 million, a decrease of \$5.4 million or minus 3.3 percent from the prior year. The total pari-mutuel tax receipts amounted to \$185,892, a decrease of approximately fourteen percent from FY 2014.

On April 24, 2014, the Legislature approved Senate Bill 1282 which was subsequently signed into law. SB 1282 legalized Advanced Deposit Wagering (ADW), a mechanism to help Arizona's racetracks to compete in a struggling market. The Racing industry relies on its patron's discretionary income and is hopeful that ADW will help evolve the industry. Advanced Deposit Wagering was authorized by the Racing Commission and on January 30, 2015 ADW permittees were authorized to implement advanced deposit wagering in Maricopa County. Pima County was prohibited from implementing ADW due to conflicting statute language that has since been corrected by the Legislature through SB 1041 which you signed into law on April 13, 2015. As of this date, the total amount of revenue generated by the industry from ADW is \$6,581,140 for FY 2015. Of this revenue, the Department's Regulation Wagering Fund received a total of \$1,334,741 for FY 2015.

Additionally, the Racing Commission approved new rules which granted the Department approval to increase the Regulatory Wager Assessment ("RWA") fees (Arizona Administrative Code R-19-205(A) and update the definition of "Telephone" (Arizona Administrative Code R-19-2-401.11) to prevent Advance Deposit Wagering providers to allow internet wagering on live and simulcast racing. The Department through its routine budget review determined that a revenue shortfall would occur by the end of FY2015, due to unexpected litigation costs. The Department drafted rule changes to increase the Regulatory Wager Assessment fee percentage from 0.60 % to 0.85% effective March 25, 2015 through November 1, 2015. Immediately after the Department authorized Advanced Deposit Wagering, the Department discovered that two of the ADW providers had launched phone applications that allowed patrons to download such applications to their smartphones and access ADW account information in addition to being capable of placing simulcast race wagers via the internet. Thus, violating Arizona Revised Statutes, A.R.S. § 13-3301.

The Boxing and Mixed Martial Arts Commission (BMMAC) supervised and regulated 37 boxing and mixed martial arts events in FY 2015. These 37 events comprised 328 individual bouts. BMMAC issued 1294 licenses and generated the following amounts: License Fees: \$39,525. Taxes: \$73,047. Fines: \$2,250. Sanction Fees: \$27,500. and Tribal Intergovernmental Agency ("IGA") Fees: \$14,000. BMMAC events and bouts have positively impacted the community and continue to bring national attention to the state.

MEET THE INTERIM DIRECTOR: RUDY J. CASILLAS



Governor Douglas Ducey appointed Rudy J. Casillas as Interim Director of the Department of Racing in January 2015. As Interim Director, Mr. Casillas is responsible for the regulation of pari-mutuel horse and greyhound racing in Arizona.

A law enforcement veteran of more than 40 years, Mr. Casillas brings extensive and valuable knowledge to the Department of Racing.

Mr. Casillas has been with the Department of Gaming since 1995, serving in various positions from special agent to his current role as deputy director. In this capacity, Mr. Casillas is responsible for overseeing various branches of the department, including Investigations & Inspections, Intelligence, Vendor Certification, Employee Certification, Games & Systems, Compliance Audit, Information Technology and Records. Mr. Casillas previously was with the Phoenix Police Department, where he began his law enforcement career in 1974.

ARIZONA RACING COMMISSION

The Arizona Racing Commission was established in 1949 by the Arizona Legislature. The Racing Commission is responsible for issuing racing dates; preparing and adopting rules to govern racing meetings as may be required to protect and promote the safety and welfare of the animals participating in racing meetings; protecting and promoting public health, safety and the proper conduct of racing and pari-mutuel wagering; conducting hearings on applications for racing permits; and conducting hearings and other legal procedures on matters relating to racing licensees and the racing industry.

Arizona Revised Statutes § 5-102 authorizes a five-member Racing Commission, who shall be appointed by the Governor pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-211. Appointment is for a term of five years. The following Commissioners were serving on the Racing Commission during FY 2015.

Jay C. McClintock Chair



Mr. McClintock has worked as a financial advisor for Moran Financial Services since 2001 helping clients plan for investment and insurance needs to prepare for retirement, estate and complete financial planning. Mr. McClintock was a thoroughbred owner in Arizona, California, and Kentucky for over 15 years.

Rory S. Goreé Vice-Chair



Mr. Goreé was honorably discharged from the United States Navy in 1993. After 10 years of service he discovered greyhounds. Since then Mr. Goreé has been involved in several capacities and positions working with the Greyhound Racing Industry and greyhound adoption and has been invited to speak at numerous greyhound adoption events as well as university, veterinarian and racing symposiums across the country and at both the American Greyhound Track Operators Association and the Association of Racing Commissioners conferences. Mr. Goreé served on the Arizona Department of Racing's committee to review and recommend greyhound racing welfare related rules. When not involved with greyhounds Mr. Goreé works as an Information Security Analyst specializing in SAP.

William "Bill" Feldmeier Racing Commissioner



Mr. Feldmeier, an Arizona native, received his bachelor's degree from Arizona State University and his master's from Prescott College.

As a Yavapai County resident, he was a County Supervisor for 11 years, served on Governor Hull's staff and was a licensed Arizona contractor. He is the owner of rental properties and has been involved in the public policy process for a number of years. He has also served as Interim Director for State Parks and as a member of the State Transportation Board.

Racing Commissioner**





Department of Racing

The primary mission of the Department of Racing is to regulate and supervise pari-mutuel horse and greyhound racing and wagering conducted in Arizona in order to protect racing participants and the wagering public. In addition, the Department regulates and supervises boxing and mixed martial arts events conducted in Arizona to protect participants in these events.



Racing Regulation Summary

Commercial Horse, Greyhound & County Fair Racing

Racing Regulation Summary

The Department of Racing's regulatory responsibilities ensure that all participants and permittees involved in commercial horse racing, greyhound racing, and county fair horse racing operate and perform in compliance with applicable Arizona statutes, rules and regulations. This is accomplished through the investigation and licensing activities of the Department.

Investigations

The Department investigates all possible violations of racing laws and rules. Investigation numbers listed below reflect the total number of investigations conducted for every incident, inspection, and background investigation, which includes processing of fingerprints and any resulting false applications. A background investigation is conducted for each license applicant who submits fingerprints as required by Department policy.

Racing Regulation

Stewards

The Board of Stewards is present on the permittee grounds on each day entries are being taken or racing is being conducted, representing the Department in all matters pertaining to the enforcement and interpretation of the rules adopted by the Department. The Stewards may impose civil penalties up to \$2,500, license suspensions up to 6 months, rule off a licensee violating Arizona statutes or rules and refer matters to the Director with recommendations of further action, including license revocation.

Director

The Director may conduct hearings on appeals of Stewards' referrals or may assign a case that has been appealed or referred to the Arizona Office of Administrative Hearings. The Administrative Law Judge provides the Director findings of fact, conclusions of law and a proposed order. The Director may accept or modify any decision proposed by the Judge. Teletracking

The Department of Racing has the authority to approve applications for teletracking (off-track betting) permits, license teletracking personnel, and monitor compliance for both operational and technical requirements. Turf Paradise, American Greyhound Racing, Inc. and Tucson Greyhound Park each held teletracking permits approved by the Arizona Racing Commission to operate off-track wagering sites in FY 2015. A total of 62 off-track-betting sites were authorized to support both greyhound and horse racing in Arizona.

The total handle generated by commercial and county fair racing for teletracking was \$122 million. This included \$102.9 million for horse racing and \$19.1 million for greyhound racing. The State of Arizona received \$83,991 in revenue from the teletracking handle, all of which was generated from the Turf Paradise handle at off-track sites.

The handle at teletracking facilities decreased 2.52% during FY 2015 when compared to the prior year.

Racing Regulation

Horse & Dog Drug Testing

The Department contracts with independent laboratories for the analysis of horse urine and blood samples and dog urine samples. This analysis is required to enforce the rules of racing that prohibit animals from racing while under the influence of foreign substances.



COMMISSIONERS



JOE PENNINGTON – Mr. Pennington is a veteran of the Commission and is currently serving as the Chairman. He first served on the Commission in 2001 following his appointment by Governor Hull. He was Chairman of the Commission from 2002 – 2004. He returned to the Commission in January 2010 by appointment of Governor Brewer. In early 2013 he was re-appointed by Governor Brewer to a second term which will expire on January 18, 2016.



SCOTT B. FLETCHER – Mr. Fletcher was appointed to the Arizona Boxing and MMA Commission by Governor Brewer in February 2011. He was Commission Chairman from January 2012 to January 2014. He was reappointed in 2014 by Governor Brewer to a second term that will end January 16, 2017.



SCOTT PETERS – Mr. Peters is a former NFL football player, competitive martial artist and advocate for concussion testing. He plans to bring forth positive changes to promote efficiency, safety and transparency to the State of Arizona. Mr. Peters was appointed to the Commission on January 19, 2015 by Governor Ducey and his current term will expire on January 15, 2018.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



MATTHEW VALENZUELA – Mr. Valenzuela has been in the industry since 1994 where he trained and competed as an amateur boxer until 1998. After his competition ended, he became an Inspector for the Arizona Boxing Commission until 2010. He gave up his status as an Inspector to become the Assistant to the Executive Director in July 2010. After a few years he was appointed as the Arizona Boxing and MMA Commission Executive Director on January 18, 2014. Since his appointment, the state has hosted the most Boxing and MMA events since the Commission' origin. Mr. Valenzuela also secured the very first UFC and World Series of Fighting title bouts in Arizona.

Boxing and Mixed Martial Arts Regulation

The Boxing and MMA Commission regulates and supervises boxing and mixed martial arts events conducted in Arizona to protect the participants and to ensure compliance with the applicable laws and regulations.

In 1992, the Arizona Department of Racing assumed responsibility for the financial administration of the Arizona State Boxing Commission. (Note: In July 2010 the name was changed to the Arizona State Boxing and MMA Commission). In this capacity, the Department collects and deposits State receipts associated with the sports. The Department collects a fee of four percent of the gross receipts after deduction of any federal, state, and local taxes generated from regulated events held on non-tribal land.

Additionally, the Boxing and MMA Commission has entered into intergovernmental agreements (IGA) with certain Tribal organizations to supervise events conducted on Tribal land. The Arizona State Boxing and MMA Commission received an average of \$2,000 per event subject to these agreements. During FY 2015, the Boxing and MMA Commission regulated 7 of these events and collected \$14,000 for their regulation. The revenues collected for taxes were deposited into the General Fund while revenues from IGA fees went into the Boxing and MMA fund.

Sanctioned Events

The Boxing and MMA Commission ensures that all events under Commission jurisdiction held in the State are sanctioned by the Arizona State Boxing and MMA Commission and that all participants are duly licensed.

Financial Information

Department of Racing Budget

The Department of Racing has an appropriation of \$2.9 million with the majority provided from the Racing Wagering Assessment (RWA). Other contributions to the Departments budget comes from licensing fees, pari-mutuel taxes, dark day assessments and Advanced Deposit Wagering Assessments (ADWA). As of 2013, the day-to-day operations of the Department are funded entirely through the racing industry and the Department only receives two General Fund appropriations for specific purposes.

In FY 2015, the Department received \$2,029,500 in General Fund appropriations; \$250,000 to be distributed solely for Arizona breeders' awards and \$1,779,500 that is passed through to the County Fair Livestock and Agriculture Promotion Fund administered by the Governor's Office. However, on May 5, 2014 Senate Bill 1282 (ADWA) was signed and had a line-item veto of \$1.2 million appropriation for the Arizona Breeders' Award Fund and County Fair Racing Fund.

The ADWA was introduced in February of 2015. In FY 2015, the RWA/ADWA handle was \$310.8 million, down from \$336.9 million in FY 2014 (-7.7%). Between July and December 2014, the RWA/ADWA handle was down - 5.5%. During the last six months of the fiscal year, the RWA/ADWA handle was down -9.3%.

In the table below, we've included expenditures for the last three fiscal years and the Department's projected expenditures for FY 2016 appropriations.

Track Capital Improvements

Capital Improvement tax breaks were first introduced into law in 1978 to encourage the improvement of racing facilities for the benefit of the public, breeders and owners, and to increase revenue to the State from the increase in pari-mutuel wagering resulting from the improvements. All Capital Improvement projects required approval from the Arizona Racing Commission. The percentages paid the State by the permittee was reduced by 1% of the total amount wagered in counties with a population over 500,000 and 2% in all other counties.

New Capital Improvement projects can no longer be submitted. This provision expired on June 30, 1992 for counties with populations of 500,000 or more and on June 30, 1999 for counties with populations of less than 500,000 according to the previous United States decennial census. The capital improvement dollars for projects approved before the expiration date may continue to be deducted from the pari-mutuel tax due until exhausted. The following table show dollars deducted by all racetracks during FY 2015. The only racetrack which has not exhausted the dollars approved is Yavapai Downs.
