31st Annual National Conference in Scottsdale Dedicated to the Memory of Senator John McCain Draws Record Attendance

Phoenix – A record number of state and tribal athletic commissioners from across the nation and globe will come together this week in Scottsdale, Arizona for the Association of Boxing Commissions and Combative Sports (ABC) 31st Annual Conference. ABC dedicated this year’s national conference, which runs from Saturday, July 27, 2019, through Wednesday, July 31, 2019, to the late Senator John McCain.

ABC will welcome hundreds of officials to the most highly attended annual conference in its 31-year history. During the five-day event hosted at the Scottsdale Resort at McCormick Ranch, officials will review and discuss the latest trends in combative sports regulation and fighter safety.
