Arizona Office of Problem Gambling Honored Agency Wins Awards for 1-800-NEXT-STEP Campaign

PHOENIX – The Arizona Office of Problem Gambling (OPG) has been honored for a public service campaign which prominently features its toll-free number, 1-800-NEXT-STEP.

The OPG, a division of the Arizona Department of Gaming, won two Bull's-Eye Ad Awards in a nationwide competition sponsored by 800response, which recognizes strategic placement and integration of Custom 800 numbers in six categories. The OPG took First Place honors in two of those categories including, "Best Use of a Custom 800 Number in Print Advertising" and "Best Use of a Custom 800 Number in Integrated Advertising Campaigns." The campaign consists of two thirty-second television spots and a series of print ads featured in gaming magazines and other publications around the state

Mark Brnovich, Director of the Arizona Department of Gaming, says winning these awards is a testament to the dedication and hard work of the people who work at and with the OPG. "An important part of our mission is to educate the public about the issue of problem gambling and where to get help if they need it." said Brnovich. "We recognize the social costs associated with legalized gambling," he says, adding, "We are doing everything we can to mitigate those costs and our public service campaign is an integral component of that mission.
