Arizona Department of Gaming Releases April Sports Betting Figures

PHOENIX – Bettors in Arizona wagered over \$535 million on sports in April of 2023, according to a new report by the Arizona Department of Gaming. This represents a 4.5% increase when compared to April of 2022.

Online wagering continues to be the favored method for those in Arizona, with mobile operators accepting over 99% of the wagers placed during the month. Retail locations accepted the approximate \$4.6 million of remaining bets in the state.

The state collected privilege fees totaling over \$3.4 million in April, resulting in over \$46 million in privilege fees collected since the start of legal operations. You can view the full April report on the ADG website: <u>LINK</u>.

Arizona currently has 17 mobile sports betting (event wagering) operators and 25 retail sports betting locations throughout the state.
