

**ARTICLE 3. MOBILE WAGERS ON RACING MEETING
OR SIMULCASTED RACES****R19-4-301. Definitions**

- A. "State" means the State of Arizona not to include the Indian lands within its exterior boundaries.
- B. "Mobile horse and dog racing pari-mutuel wagering system" means the hardware, software, firmware, communications technology, other equipment, as well as operator procedures implemented to allow player participation in pari-mutuel wagering as allowed under A.R.S. Title 5, Chapter 1 and A.R.S. 5-1314(B), and, if supported, the corresponding equipment related to the display of the pari-mutuel wager outcomes, and other similar information necessary to facilitate player participation. The system provides the player with the means to place and manage pari-mutuel wagers. The system provides the operator with the means to review pari-mutuel player accounts, if supported, suspend events, generate various pari-mutuel wagering/financial transaction and account reports, input outcomes for events, and set any configurable parameters.

R19-4-302. Standards

- A. With respect to the pari-mutuel wagers it is authorized to offer and receive pursuant to A.R.S. Title 5, Chapter 1, a permittee under that chapter may accept approved pari-mutuel wagers from persons in the State by means of a mobile or electronic device pursuant to A.R.S. § 5-1314(B).
- B. A permittee may accept approved pari-mutuel wagers on mobile or electronic devices so long as:
 - 1. The activity otherwise meets the requirements of A.R.S. Title 5, Chapter 1; and
 - 2. The wagers are offered and accepted by a mobile horse and dog racing pari-mutuel wagering system that complies with Gaming Laboratories International (GLI) Standards GLI-33, including any appendices, and any future amendments and updates thereto. If GLI ceases to publish this standard, then they shall be replaced by corresponding and equally rigorous technical standards adopted by the Department.

R19-4-303. Other Requirements

- A. The permittee shall have, and meet the requirements of, an internal control system that addresses the topics covered in R19-4-111, 113, 115-117, 119-128, 130, 132-136, 149-150, and which shall be designed to ensure the integrity of pari-mutuel player accounts, pari-mutuel wagering, and the mobile horse and dog racing pari-mutuel wagering system.
- B. The internal control systems for permittees and their mobile horse and dog racing pari-mutuel wagering systems shall be at least as stringent as the system and rules that exist for responsible parties and event wagering systems under Article 1.
- C. Each permittee's internal control system, and any changes thereto, shall have received written approval from the Department prior to implementation and the acceptance of any wagers.
