Arizona Department of Gaming Releases May Sports Betting Figures

PHOENIX – Bettors in Arizona wagered over \$451 million on sports in May of 2023, according to a new report by the Arizona Department of Gaming. This represents a 2.1% decrease when compared to the same month of last year.

Arizona has seen over \$2.8 billion wagered through the first five months of 2023 and has surpassed \$10.6 billion in total wagers placed since the inception of legal sports betting in 2021.

The state collected approximately \$3.4 million in privilege fees in May, resulting in nearly \$50 million in privilege fees collected since the start of legal operations. You can view the full May report on the ADG website: <u>LINK.</u>
