NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING OF THE ARIZONA RACING COMMISSION FOR THE PURPOSE OF RATIFYING PAST ACTION TAKEN VIOLATION OF OPEN MEETING LAWS

Pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-431-05, notice is hereby given to the members of the Arizona Racing Commission and to the general public that the Arizona Racing Commission will hold a meeting open to the public on **Wednesday, November 10, 2021, at 10:00 AM** via Google Meet.

Due to the on-going public health concern, the Commission will not meet in person and will meet via video conference. The public may attend this meeting one of the following ways:

The purpose of the meeting is to ratify an action of the Arizona Racing Commission that may have been taken in violation of the Open Meeting Law. This action involved:

An October 13, 2021 non-objection by the Arizona Racing Commission to the request for a continuance by Arizona Downs and Turf Paradise.

The public may obtain a detailed written description of the action to be ratified, and all deliberations, consultations, and decisions by members of the public body that preceded and relate to this action to be ratified at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting.

Pursuant to Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Arizona Racing Commission will not discriminate on the basis of disability in admission to and observation of its public meetings. Persons with disability may request a reasonable accommodation, such as a sign language interpreter, by contacting the Arizona Racing Commission office at 602-255-3876. Requests should be made as early as possible to allow time to arrange the accommodation.
